Holy mother of our Redeemer, thou gate leading to heaven and star of the sea; help the falling people who seek to rise, thou who, all nature wondering, didst give birth to thy holy Creator. Virgin always, hearing the greeting from Gabriel's lips, take pity on sinners. Amen.

AVE REGINA CAELORUM. CANDLEMAS - EASTER
Hail, queen of heaven, hail lady of the angels. Hail, root, hail the door through which the Light of the world is risen. Rejoice, glorious Virgin, beautiful above all. Hail, O very fair one, and plead for us to Christ. Amen.

REGINA CAELI EASTER - PENTECOST
queen of Heaven, rejoice, alleluia. For He whom you did merit to bear, alleluia. Has risen, as he said, alleluia. Pray for us to God, alleluia. Rejoice and be glad, O Virgin Mary, alleluia. For the Lord has truly risen, alleluia.

When you dive into liturgical living there are an overwhelming amount of ideas and suggestions for commemorating the multitude of feasts and fasts within the Church year. However, we are not only called to live our Catholic faith on days when there is a feast or fast, but each and every day. That is why in this collection you'll find all the traditional prayers, hymns, and indulgences our family has used to build a Liturgy of Life. So that you too can have the foundation to live liturgically no matter what day it may be and build a habit of holiness in your home for every season.

We begin with the prayers that focus on the dedication of each month and then add those for each day of the week. Like a Rule of Life for an individual, a family's Liturgy of Life is the spiritual foundation for the day that all liturgical living can be built upon. We may not all live in a monastery or convent, but we can all follow the example of religious life in taking time throughout the day to recollect our family to God in the midst of our daily tasks. And the habit of a Liturgy of Life is a great tool we can use to do this. I pray that this Liturgy of Life is as much of a blessing for your family as it has been for ours.

The Doxology Hymn

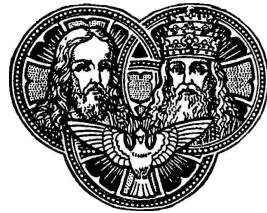
These four lines were written as the standard ending to several hymns by the English Rev. Thomas Ken in 1673, as part of his A Manual of Prayers for the Use of Winchester College. It is most often sung to the profane hymn tune called Old Hundredth composed by Louis Bourgeois in 1551.

GLORIA IN EXCELSIS DEO

*This is the Major Doxology prayed at the Holy Sacrifice of the Mass.
It was brought to the Western Church by St. Hilary in the 4th century.
Here is can be prayed or chanted together, or the Doxology Hymn sung.*

Glory be to God on high and on earth peace, goodwill towards men. We praise Thee, we bless Thee, we worship Thee, we glorify Thee, we give thanks to Thee for Thy great glory, O Lord God, heavenly King, God the Father Almighty. O Lord the only begotten Son, Jesus Christ; O Lord God, Lamb of God, Son of the Father., that takest away the sins of the world, have mercy upon us. Thou that takest away the sins of the world, receive our prayer. Thou that sittest at the right hand of God the Father, have mercy upon us. For Thou only art holy, Thou only art the Lord; Thou only, O Christ, with the Holy Ghost, art most high in the glory of God the Father. Amen.

FEBRUARY: HOLY FAMILY PRAYER

Who livest and reignest world without end. Amen.

MARCH: MEMORARE OF ST. JOSEPH

Remember, O most chaste spouse of the Virgin Mary, that never was it known that anyone who implored your help and sought your intercession were left unassisted. Full of confidence in your power I fly unto you and beg your protection. Despise not O Guardian of the Redeemer my humble supplication, but in your bounty, hear and answer me. Amen.

JULY: ADORATION PRAYER TO THE PRECIOUS BLOOD

O most precious blood of Jesus Christ, adoration and praise be yours forever. Amen.

WEDNESDAY:
Jesus Christ, Son of the living God, give thanks to the eternal Father in heaven in the name of all the children of God. Redeemed by Thy Precious Blood, we have grown up and been reared in the true faith. A favorite children of God we have been loaded down with the gifts of nature and grace of the Holy Ghost. And like so many others we have been ungrateful children of God. Therefore we beseech Thee, only-begotten of the Father, do Thou deign on this day to unite Thy divine thanksgiving with ours, that we may render a worthy return to God our Lord, and a worthy reparation for our own ingratitude and that of all mankind. Praise and thanksgiving be to the Father, through the Son in the Holy Ghost from everlasting to everlasting! Amen.

THURSDAY:

“The Word was made flesh and dwelt among us.” Thanks be to Thee, divine Redeemer, Who in Thy love wishest to be all like to us. Still further hast Thou loved us - for having loved, Thou didst love us unto the end. Day by day Thou presents Thyself on our altars before the Father a victim for us. 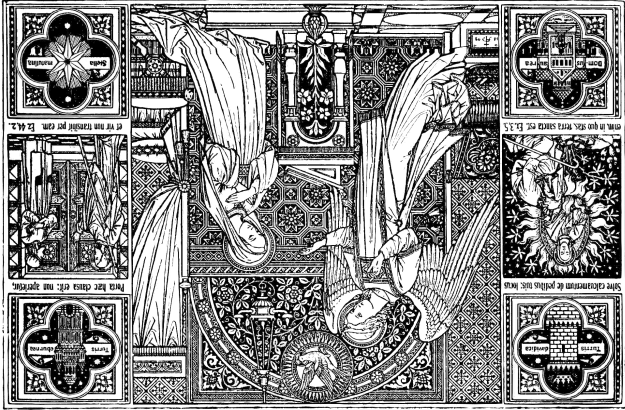
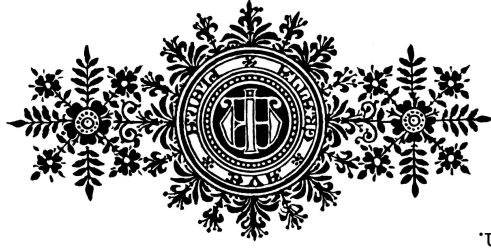
